There were 17 attendees at this event, and we hope to have additional events like this in the future.











The after-school program is known as "Kings and Queens" and is free for children ages 8-18 who live in Winton Terrace. Organizers of the program said a few dozen children

take advantage of it every day.

On Friday alone, around 40 kids were playing sports and video games, eating snacks and being tutored through the program.

Register for Portal

- 1. Go to https://myinfo.cintimha.com/ and select Resident Login (Login picture)
- 2. The login screen will appear. Scroll down to register here and click the red link.
- 3. You will be prompted to enter your registration code here. Enter the code.
- 4. Now complete the registration process by creating a user name (email address) and entering a password.
 - a. Save the information in your records
- 5. Once registered you can start using the Portal.
- 6. Go to https://myinfo.cintimha.com/ and select Resident Login
- 7. The login screen will appear. Login with the information you just entered.
- 8. Once logged in, your Home screen will appear. Select the menu button for the action you want to take. (home screen photo)
